Understanding Grant Funding and the Transformation of Riverhead Square.

I'd like to shed light on the funding behind the transformative projects in our town centre, especially focusing on the recent comments regarding Riverhead Square.

Recently, we updated our followers about the anticipated completion of Riverhead Square by the end of February. One response raised a concern: "more money wasted by the council, when this taxpayers' money could be used for more important things."

Let's clarify this. The funds for Riverhead Square's regeneration are sourced from the Town Deal, secured in 2020. This funding is specifically allocated for designated projects in the town centre and cannot be arbitrarily redirected.

Securing government funding grants is a challenging process, involving extensive work and meticulous planning. Successful applications mean the grant must be exclusively used for the proposed project. In this case, for the enhancement of our town centre.

Our community voiced their desire for a more pleasant, inviting area by the river in surveys conducted by North East Lincolnshire Council (NELC). The completion of Riverhead Square is a direct response to this feedback, aiming to enrich our town's aesthetic and social fabric.

At the 2025 Group, we believe in transparency and education. It's vital our community understands the nuances of funding and how it directly impacts the development of our town.

Moreover, the 2025 Group provides a platform for you to voice your opinions on how town centre funding should be utilized. While not all ideas may be feasible, your input is invaluable, and many suggestions do shape our projects.

Regeneration Projects Coming To The Town.

In the upcoming years, Grimsby's town centre will undergo a transformative makeover.

Several exciting projects are set to materialise between now and the end of 2025.

- Changing Freshney Place into a mixed retail and leisure space with parkway cinemas to provide a 5-screen cinema, additional leisure activities, retail space, a new market hall, and food/beverage options.
- Refurbishment of Central Library, bringing the upper floors back into use.
- Creation of a new, green, public space at Riverhead Square, which has already been started.
- Improving cycle/pedestrian routes in the town centre.
- A new housing complex, providing high quality, energy efficient, town centre housing.
- NHS Diagnostic Centre.
- Horizon Youth Zone.
- Grimsby Projekt Renewable (a learning/leisure container installation)
- St James House which will become a business hub, and is being brought to you by the E-Factor Group.
- The old BHS building will become the new market hall and work has already started to remove the asbestos from the building.
- An Organisation called "Care" will be taking over the Royal Bank of Scotland building this building will become the Care Community Hub.

Many of the shop fronts are going to receive a makeover, thanks to Dan Clarke and his team at Grimbarians.
